BAILIFF: Le Cocq, as you have shown that you can benefit from training and help, we are going to give you that option. It is entirely up to you how you take it. We are going to place you on probation for three years for the offences you have committed, under the following condition:-

"That you will reside in an approved probation hostel for a maximum period of twelve months, and you will abide by the rules in force and you will comply with any reasonable directions that may be given to you by members of the staff."

And so, if you go there and misbehave and they have to remove you, you will come back here and you will be punished for breach of probation, won't you.

And now, Tregaskis, in order that you would be dealt with in more or less the same way as Le Cocq, we're not going to place you on probation, we're going to impose a prison sentence which will enable you to be released. And therefore, we will sentence you for the various Counts to six months and six months concurrent, and I think the last matter is Count 30, for the malicious damage - 1 week imprisonment, concurrent. So, you will be sentenced to a total of six months imprisonment, which therefore I think will enable his immediate release.

And I hope you don't come back again, either of you.
