JUDG MENT

BAILIFF: You are obviously making an effort now and it is perfectly true that you did go to the Social Security Office and we think, perhaps, we can reduce the fine slightly, giving you credit for that. You will pay £10 for each failure to return your schedules and £50 for failing to make the payment, which is a total of £480 and there is of course in default three

days' imprisonment in respect of each of the £10 and ten days in respect of each failure to pay £50. You will have to make arrangements with the Viscount as to how you are going to pay this off; you will have to add it to your monthly outgoings, but as long as you do that then the prison sentence will not apply.
