**JUDGMENT**

COMMISSIONER LE CRAS: We note that there is no appeal against the sentence of seven days' imprisonment. So far as relates to the sentence of three months' imprisonment, it is clear that the learned Magistrate was not in possession of all the facts.

In this unhappy case we propose to quash the sentence of three months' imprisonment and to restore the original order of the 1st August, 1989, that is one year's probation and a total of 100 hours of community

service. We note counsel's assurance that accommodation is available and we wish to express our hope that Mr. Craig will avail himself of the facilities for help which are on offer to him.
