JUDGMENT

BAILIFF: DP, because of your age, we cannot deal with you in any other way, or at least there are other ways but this is the most appropriate way. You came to this Island wanted by the police and started within a very short time to commit offences. Of course that must not happen; you are very young; you are not unintelligent; you seem to have some ability as a rider. If you go back to England and are dealt with there and have a probation officer to assist you or someone of that sort after you have served your term, I hope that you will take advantage of it and obtain employment at a riding stable where I am told according to the reports there is an opportunity and you can do something useful. In the meantime you must go to Borstal. You will be sentenced to Borstal training which of course will be converted when you get to

England to twelve months' youth custody and until then you will be remanded in custody.
