OFFENCE:

Arson.

PLEA:

Guilty.

DETAILS OF OFFENCE:

When intoxicated and depressed set fire to curtain in her room - alarm activated and put out quickly - damage not extensive - seven other people in building - defendant refused to leave building - said trying to kill herself.

DETAILS MITIGATION:

First offence. Severely disturbed.

PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:

None.

CONCLUSIONS:

Probation three years.

SENTENCE AND OBSERVATIONS:

Probation three years - condition to continue psychiatric treatment and to attend Camphill Trust in Bristol or similar institution.

JUDGMENT

BAILIFF: You are put on probation for three years and it means that you have got to live and work where your probation officer tells you. If you don't or if you commit any other offences and you do not stick to your probation or if you go for treatment and then abscond if you do any of those things and you are brought back to this Court then I do not know what sentence the prosecution will move for but it could be different from probation.

We will grant the order, you are placed on probation for three years to live and work as directed by the probation officer. To be of good behaviour during that period, to come up for sentence if required to do so and it is a condition that you should attend, if a place is found for you, at the Camphill Trust, Bristol or any other similar institution and you will continue with your treatment under Dr. Faiz.
