JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: We grant the conclusions. You evaded your responsibilities to your fellow employers in the trades in Jersey; they had to carry you. You were a parasite and you are very fortunate that the law does not allow us to send you to prison because we think you deserve it.

You are sentenced to probation for one year to live and work as directed by your Probation Officer, to be of good behaviour

during that time, and you will be brought back here for sentence if you do not comply. You will carry out 120 hours community service to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer on each of the 6 counts concurrent.
