## JUDGMENT

Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rule 21

- 1. Leave is given to amend the claim of discrimination to include a claim of direct sexual discrimination. This claim was then withdrawn by the claimant and is dismissed.
- 2. The claim of unpaid holiday pay is withdrawn by the claimant and is dismissed.
- 3. The claim of discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation was withdrawn by the claimant and is dismissed.
- 4. The respondent has made an unauthorised deduction from the claimant's wages and is ordered to pay the claimant the gross sum of two hundred and eighty nine pounds and seventy six pence together with fourteen hundred pounds of unpaid wages (gross). The respondent is thus ordered to pay the claimant sixteen hundred and eighty nine pounds and seventy six pence in total. This sum is to be paid within 14 days hereof.

## THE EMPLOYMENT TRIBUNALS (INTEREST) ORDER 1990

Tribunal case number: 2421295/2017

Name of case: Mrs DJ Oliver v Catch22buses Limited

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties.
