## VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

## CAP. XX.

An Act respecting the Issue of Writs of Habeas Corpus out of England into Her Majesty's [16th May 1862.] Possessions Abroad.

THEREAS it is expedient that Writs of Habeas Corpus should not issue out of England into any Colony or Foreign Dominion of the Crown where Her Majesty has a lawfully established Court or Courts of Justice having Authority to grant and issue the said Writ, and to ensure the due Execution thereof throughout such Colony or Foreign Dominion: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

1. No Writ of Habeas Corpus shall issue out of England, by Writ not to Authority of any Judge or Court of Justice therein, into any Colony issue out of England into or Foreign Dominion of the Crown where Her Majesty has a lawfully any Colony, established Court or Courts of Justice having Authority to grant and &c. having a Court with issue the said Writ, and to ensure the due Execution thereof through- Authority to out such Colony or Dominion.
