ROAD TRAFFIC

The A12 Trunk Road (A12/A414 Maldon Road Interchange Junction 18, Near Sandon, Essex) Northbound Exit Slip Road (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - *13 September 2010*

Coming into force - - *20 September 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A12 Trunk Road (“the A12”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads in the County of Essex should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed nearby:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A12 Trunk Road (A12/A414 Maldon Road Interchange Junction 18, Near Sandon, Essex) Northbound Exit Slip Road (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 20 September 2010.

2. Subject as mentioned in article 3 of this Order no person shall, during a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 27 September 2010 or on any subsequent day until nearby local authority works to resurface the A414 Maldon Road Park and Ride Roundabout have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A12 northbound exit slip road at Junction 18 leading to the A414 Maldon Road Interchange near Sandon.

3. The provisions of article 2 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority, ambulance or traffic officer purposes, or proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable or a traffic officer in uniform.
