The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Bournemouth Air Festival) Regulations 2011

Made - - - - *25th March 2011*
Coming into force - - *18th August 2011*

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Bournemouth, Dorset by reason of the holding of flying displays that are scheduled to take place during the period from 18th to 21st August 2011.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Bournemouth Air Festival) Regulations 2011 and come into force on 18th August 2011.

2. In regulation 3 all times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time.

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between—

- (a) 1200 hours and 2000 hours on 18th August,
- (b) 1200 hours and 2000 hours on 19th August,
- (c) 1100 hours and 1700 hours on 20th August, and
- (d) 1100 hours and 1700 hours on 21st August

in 2011, no aircraft is to fly below 5,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points—

504405N 0014703W;
504016N 0014604W;
503914N 0015537W; and
504304N 0015636W

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying—

- (a) in accordance with a clearance issued by the air traffic control unit at either Bournemouth Airport or Southampton Airport; or
- (b) with the permission of the flying display director for the Bournemouth Air Festival.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in airspace in the vicinity of the seafront at Bournemouth, Dorset during the Bournemouth Air Festival which will take place between 18th and 21st August 2011. A large number of aircraft will be involved in high-energy manoeuvres during the Air Festival. The Civil Aviation Authority considers that flying should be restricted for reasons of public safety and this has been agreed with its Directorate of Airspace Policy (DAP) and the Department for Transport.

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be published by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
