**The M1 Motorway (Long Eaton, Derbyshire) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

Made - - - - 29th June 2012

Coming into force - - 6th July 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway (“the M1”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway, west of Long Eaton in the County of Derbyshire, should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Long Eaton, Derbyshire) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 6th July 2012.

2. In this Order –

| "the motorway" | means the northbound carriageway of the M1 from a point 850 metres south of the centreline of the B6540 Tamworth Road underbridge to the centreline of Draycott Road/Sawley Road underbridge; |
| "the Regulations" | means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b) |
| "a hard shoulder" | means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the second length of motorway; |
| "the works period" | means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 9th July 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed; |

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the motorway.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle –
(i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or
(ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;
(iii) used for special forces purposes.

6. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
