ROAD TRAFFIC

The A19 Trunk Road (Stockton Ring Road to Wolviston Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - *16th August 2012*

Coming into force - - *27th August 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A19 Trunk Road and connecting roads, in the District of Stockton-on-Tees, is satisfied that traffic on that trunk road and some of those connecting roads should be prohibited because carriageway marking and road stud renewal works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A19 Trunk Road (Stockton Ring Road to Wolviston Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 27th August 2012.

2. In this Order; -

“the A19” means the A19 Trunk Road;

“the northbound carriageway” means the A19 northbound carriageway between the nose of the northbound exit slip road at the A1027 Stockton Road Interchange and the nose of the northbound entry slip road at the A689 Wolviston Interchange, a distance of approximately 4600 metres;

“the southbound carriageway” means the A19 southbound carriageway between the nose of the southbound exit slip road at Wolviston Interchange and the nose of the southbound entry slip road at Stockton Road Interchange, a distance of approximately 4600 metres;

“a slip road” means any of the following A19 slip roads:

- (a) the northbound entry and southbound exit slip roads at Stockton Road Interchange; and
- (b) the northbound exit and southbound entry slip roads at Wolviston Interchange;

“a layby” means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the A19 over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“the works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Tuesday 28th August 2012 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the northbound carriageway, the southbound carriageway or a slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or wait in the laybys situated adjacent to the A19:

- (i) northbound carriageway approximately 1250 metres and 2900 metres north of Stockton Road Interchange overbridge; or
- (ii) southbound carriageway approximately 950 metres and 2900 metres north of Stockton Road Interchange overbridge.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
