ROAD TRAFFIC

The A14 Trunk Road (Junction 49 Tot Hill Interchange to Junction 51 Beacon Hill Interchange, Suffolk) Eastbound (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - *10th September 2012*

Coming into force - - *17th September 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A14 Trunk Road (“the A14”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and on some of those connecting roads in the County of Suffolk should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A14 Trunk Road (Junction 49 Tot Hill Interchange to Junction 51 Beacon Hill Interchange, Suffolk) Eastbound (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 17th September 2012.

2. In this Order –

“tip of the nosing” means, as indicated by the road markings on the carriageway, the first point where an entry slip road joins, or the last point where an exit slip road leaves, the carriageway of the trunk road;

“the first length of trunk road” means the eastbound carriageway of the A14 from the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 49 Tot Hill Interchange to the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road at Junction 50 Cedars Interchange;

“the second length of trunk road” means the eastbound carriageway of the A14 from the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road at Junction 50 Cedars Interchange to a point 200 metres east of the centre point of the over bridge at Junction 51 Beacon Hill Interchange;

“the slip road” means the A14 eastbound exit slip road to Junction 50 Cedars Interchange;

“a slip road” means the A14 eastbound –

(a) entry slip road from Junction 50 Cedars Interchange, and

(b) exit slip road to Junction 51 Beacon Hill Interchange;

“lay-by” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this

definition "carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a trunk road (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

"works" mean carriageway resurfacing;

"the works period" means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 1st October 2012 and ending when the works have been completed;

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 1st October 2012, or on any subsequent day until the works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the first length of trunk road or the slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter -
(a) or proceed in the second length of trunk road or a slip road, during a works period, or
(b) enter any lay-by adjacent to the second length of trunk road, during the works period.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of article 4 shall not apply to a vehicle –
(a) being used in connection with the works or for traffic officer purposes,
(b) being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes,
(c) proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or traffic officer in uniform, or
(d) proceeding from Beacon Hill Services at Junction 51.

and nothing in article 3 shall apply to a vehicle being used for a purpose specified in paragraph (b) of this article or to a vehicle falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011^(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
