**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A259 Trunk Road (Little Common Road, Bexhill)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

*Made* - - - - *20th February 2012*

*Coming into force* - - *10th March 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A259 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16A(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A259 Trunk Road (Little Common Road, Bexhill) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 10th March 2012.

2. In this Order:

“the length of trunk road” means the A259 Trunk Road (Little Common Road) roundabout at its junction with Cooden Sea Road (B2182) at Bexhill;

“event” means a ceremony at the war memorial to honour those lost on active service since the end of World War II; and

“an event period” means a period of 2 hours starting at 1400 hours on Sunday 18th March 2012 or on any subsequent Sunday until Sunday 8th April 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during an event period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the length of trunk road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs or a constable, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes; or
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
