**The A590 Trunk Road (Ulverston Road Bus Stop Laybys)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - - *24th September 2014*

Coming into force - - *11th October 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport being the traffic authority for the A590 Trunk Road and is satisfied that traffic on sections of that trunk road in the District of Barrow in Furness in the County of Cumbria, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A590 Trunk Road (Ulverston Road Bus Stop Laybys) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 11th October 2014.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A590 Trunk Road;

“works” means resurfacing and associated works on the trunk road;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 in schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 (b) and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway on the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed;

“the first layby to be closed” means the bus stop layby adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road at a point 120 metres east of the centreline of the junction of the trunk road with The Green (unclassified road);

“the second layby to be closed” means the bus stop layby adjacent to the westbound carriageway of the trunk road at a point 120 metres east of the centreline with London Road (unclassified road);

“the works period” means a period starting at 2000 hours on Sunday 12th October 2014 and ending at 2359 hours on Sunday 23rd November 2014. However, works may start and continue beyond these dates for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first and second laybys to be closed.
4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance services, vehicles being used in connection with the works or by traffic officers or to any vehicle proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
